1. CALL TO ORDER: Chair Collins called the meeting to order at 4:00p.m.

- **2. PUBLIC COMMENTS:** As a public comment, Mason Einhorn indicated that flooding issues at Oakmont Park is causing erosion and oak trees being washed away. Mr. Einhorn requested the item be placed on the next agenda for discussion.
- **3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** approval of minutes of the regular meeting of the May 9, 2019, and special meeting of June 1, 2019, were approved with a motion from Commissioner Cencirulo, seconded by Commissioner Johnson, and carried.
- **4. PRESENTATION:** Bob Mitchell, Commissioner on the San Bernardino County Regional Parks Advisory Commission provided an update on Pickle Ball courts in the City, including that the Redlands Unified School District have approved the addition of 12 courts at Clement Middle School. Mr. Mitchell indicated that additional courts would provide the opportunity to hold classes and tournaments, both of which would be revenue generating.
