I. CALL TO ORDER AND PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD - 3 MINUTES

Vice Chairman Shan McNaughton called the meeting to order, and opened up the Public Comment period. There were no comments forthcoming and the Public Comment period was closed.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. Minutes of April 2, 2015

It was moved by Commissioner Paige Peyton, seconded by Commissioner Nathan Gonzales, and carried on a 5-0 vote (Chairman David Van Diest, and Commissioner Donn Grenda absent) to approve the minutes of April 2, 2015.

V. NEW BUSINESS

Vice Chairman McNaughton recused himself, due to a conflict of interest on the following project.

A. NABIL AYOUB, APPLICANT

(PROJECT PLANNER: PATRICIA BRENES)

- 1. Consideration of a Notice of Exemption pursuant to Section 15162 of the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines.
- 2. PUBLIC HEARING to consider Certificate of Appropriateness No. 488 for exterior modifications to a 4,164 square foot historic building known as Heritage Hall (Historic Resource No. 117) for adaptive reuse as a restaurant consisting of the construction of 706 square feet of terraces with trellises for outdoor dining along the southerly and easterly elevations, and restoration and repainting, located at 255 E. Olive Avenue in the C-3 (General Commercial) District.

Commissioner Gonzales opened up the Public Hearing. There were no comments forthcoming and the Public Hearing was closed.

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION MOTION:

It was moved by Commissioner Peyton, seconded by Commissioner Kurt Heidelberg and carried on a 4-0 vote (Chairman Van Diest and Commissioner Grenda absent, Vice Chairman McNaughton abstained) that the Historic and Scenic Preservation Commission find that Certificate of Appropriateness No. 488 is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to Section 15162 of the CEQA Guidelines.

CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATENESS MOTION:

It was moved by Commissioner Peyton seconded by Commissioner Alison Roedl and carried on a 4-0 vote (Chairman Van Diest and Commissioner Grenda absent, Vice Chairman McNaughton abstained) that the Historic and Scenic Preservation Commission find that Certificate of Appropriateness No. 488 is not detrimental to the Historic Resource and is consistent with the City's Historic Preservation Ordinance, and therefore approve Certificate of Appropriateness No. 488 subject to the Conditions of Approval.

Vice Chairman McNaughton rejoined the Historic and Scenic Preservation Commission meeting.

B. **DIVERSIFIED PACIFIC, APPLICANT** (PROJECT PLANNER: SEAN P. KELLEHER)

An opportunity for the Historic and Scenic Preservation Commission to provide comments on the Cultural Analysis section of the Initial Study for **Tentative Tract No. 18979** to subdivide approximately 32.28 acres into fifty five (55) lots for single family residential use and one (1) lettered lot for open space purposes located on the south side of San Bernardino Avenue, approximately 600 feet east of Judson Street in the A-1 (Agricultural) District (Proposed change to R-E (Residential Estate) District., which will include the demolition of two structures over fifty years old in the A-1 (Agricultural) District.
