A.) Roy Bettencourt's report was read by Chuck Hills.

- B.) Farming Report by Chuck Hills:
 - 1) Skirt Pruning on Mountain View
 - 2) Prune Late on 5th Ave Grove
 - 3) Well has no water on Texas. There is a non-potable well on Texas, but the well on Texas has known E-coli contamination.
 - 4)The groves are infected with fleabane, Larry Jacinto is changing the chemistry with round up and Fermoxin.
- C.) Financial Update of the Citrus Grove
 - 1) Staff presented a quarterly update of the Grove finances. Chairman Buoye said not to expect as high of returns on the Citrus groves due to labor costs going up.
 - 2. Member Irwin asked why Prospect Park cost almost \$80,000 for maintaining the grove.

- A.) Staff reported that Riverview grove has been submitted to the county for review. Staff is expecting a full report of the new part of the grove. Commission member Irwin asked if we could put a different species of fruit other than a Washington Navel, and wondered about Cara Caras. A commission member replied that Cara Caras are easily stolen and wouldn't be good for a walking trail.

 - 1) Lugonia groves are being well trimmed; concern was expressed that some of the trunks needed Ridimil and gold.
