**NOTICE OF HEARING**

**RE: DANGEROUS/VICIOUS DOG/1675 Industrial Park Avenue, Apt. 213 Redlands, CA**

The City of Redlands Animal Services has been notified by ██████████ of a vicious/dangerous animal at the above-reference address. On 5/09/2023 and 3/23/2024, there was an incident involving Pitbulls "Minnie" and "Midnight" ("subject animals") resulting in injury to another domestic animal. The incident supports a determination that pursuant to Redlands Municipal Code Section 6.05.010, the subject animal is a dangerous/vicious dog as follows:

Redlands Municipal Code Section 6.05.010: "Any dog which, when unprovoked, on two (2) separate occasions within the prior thirty-six (36) month period, has seriously bitten, inflicted injury attacking a domestic animal off the property of the owner or keeper".

This is to advise you that the Animal Control Board will hold a hearing on **May 22, 2024 at 3:00 p.m. at 35 Cajon St. Suite 2, Redlands, CA 92373** to determine if the subject animal is a dangerous/vicious dog pursuant to the authorities set forth above. You are encouraged to attend and present evidence at the hearing.

After the hearing, the Animal Control Board shall notify you of its determination and any orders issued by the Animal Control Board. If the Board determines that the subject animal is potentially dangerous/vicious, the owner or keeper of the subject animal shall comply with the Board's orders within ten (10) days after the date of the determination.

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**PETITION FOR A HEARING  
TO DETERMINE IF DOG IS POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS/VICIOUS  
PURSUANT TO REDLANDS MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 6.05.060**

This Petition for a Hearing to Determine if Dogs are Potentially Dangerous is brought pursuant to Redlands Municipal Code 6.05.050 which requires that the chief officer of the public pound or animal control department or his or her immediate supervisor or the chief of police or his or her designee shall petition for a hearing to determine whether or not the dog in question be declared potentially dangerous or vicious.

On April 4, 2024, an animal control officer investigated and determined that probable cause exists to believe that the dogs are Potentially Dangerous. The following incident supports this belief as per Redlands Municipal Code Section 6.05.010:

Any dog which, when unprovoked, on two (2) separate occasions within the prior thirty-six (36) month period, has seriously bitten, inflicted injury attacking a domestic animal off the property of the owner or keeper.



12/14/23 08:28 Bite occurred 12/14 around 4:00pm when Maintenance worker [REDACTED] was fulfilling a maintenance request and was standing on a ladder and when he began stepping down, the black and brown dog owned by [REDACTED] began biting at his shin while the other joined in but did not break skin. Animal Owner is [REDACTED] and lives in room 213 at 1675 Industrial Park Ave. Redlands CA. Animal Control to follow up with Step Up and animal owner this AM.

12/14/23 13:24 Made contact with victim, [REDACTED] a maintenance worker for the complex, who stated he was walking out of the apartment to turn off the water when black dog, possibly "Minnie" bit him on his leg, breaking the skin, and the other dog grabbed a hold of his calf but didn't break skin. The dogs had been sitting on the couch unleashed with the owner prior to the incident. The victim described the other dog as a brown dog. The victim was unsure if the bite dog, the black dog, was a male or female. The bite was minor and the victim did not receive any medical attention.

Due to the current incident as well as prior incidents with the same dogs property management advised the owner the dogs needed to be removed by 12/14/23. The owner had told property management he would be taking the dogs to the wash. I advised property management of the quarantine period and they might allow the bite dog to stay during the period. I advised the importance of releasing the dog from quarantine.

I attempted to make contact with the dog owner, [REDACTED] with a step-up case worker but he did not answer his dog. I notice was left on his door to contact our department as soon as possible. JK

12/15/23 12:59 Attempted to contact owner by phone, number no longer in service. JK

12/15/23 17:07 Made contact with owner [REDACTED] he stated Minnie bit the worker, I took pictures of both dogs, Minnie and Midnight, both dogs appeared healthy except Midnight appeared to have an ear infection.

I spoke to the victim and showed him both pictures, he confirmed Midnight was the dog that bit him.

I advised Mr. Frey that Midnight was the bite dog, Mr. [REDACTED] signed the quarantine form and he was given a copy. I advised would be back on 12/23/23 to release Midnight from quarantine. JK

Adair cannot state who the animal owner is but that they live on the same level and near each other. The animal owners supposed name is "Rowland". I contacted RPD in regards to the case and they provided the only two names given were [REDACTED] and another victim by the name [REDACTED]

I contacted [REDACTED] to ask who [REDACTED] was and she was very hesitant to give up any information in regards to who he was until I advised he was listed as a victim in the case as well as her. [REDACTED] did not respond and I advised I will continue to reach out to management at Step Up and figure out what is going on.

03/23/24 12:33 - [REDACTED] called and left a voicemail advising that [REDACTED] and her husband "[REDACTED]" and [REDACTED] is "Roland". [REDACTED] also advised to have someone give her a call on Tuesday.

## Activity Card

03/28/24 10:09 KEG - On 3/28/24 I arrived at 1675 Industrial Park Ave in regards to a recent report of a dog attack. When I arrived I met with manager [REDACTED] who was able to pull up video footage of the attack that occurred. After obtaining the footage I spoke to [REDACTED] and she advised this is now the fourth incident, the third recorded that Step Up has had in regards to animal owner Keith Frey. Redlands Animal Shelter has also recorded three incidents in regards to [REDACTED]'s dogs. Two dog attacks, both resulting in hospitalized animals as well as a minor bite on a maintenance worker at the Step up property. I advised [REDACTED] that due to the severity of the attack on both dogs there is a possibility Redlands Animal Shelter will be pursuing Potentially Dangerous or Viscious animal and may be seizing the animal. [REDACTED] was also given a business card and asked to forward any paperwork given to her by victim [REDACTED] to my email, which I was immediately sent a copy of the veterinary bill given to her by [REDACTED]

After arriving back at the shelter supervisor Jodi Kroeger was notified of the incident, the severity and all information regarding this attack and agreed that Redlands Animal Shelter will be pursuing Potentially Dangerous for [REDACTED]'s animals.

[REDACTED] contacted RAS as I arrived back and once notified about needing a written statement she advised that she will be home later today and I can stop by. Report will be updated once I receive a written statement.

04/04/24 15:57 Officer Girouz and I attempted to seize the dogs. When we knocked on the door, no barking was heard inside the apartment. Mr. Frey came to the door and stated he needed to get dressed. He shut the door then a young woman exited the apartment and said " I have to leave." Then Mr. [REDACTED] opened the door and stated the dogs were not there. I asked where the dog were at, he stated he took them somewhere and they got loose. I advised he needed to find the dogs since he would be liable if anything happened and also the dog Minnie was microchipped to him. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he understood.

We spoke to [REDACTED] at Step-up and advised on the situation. She was going to check cameras to see if the dogs were taken to another apartment in the complex. If she get additional details, she will let us know.JK

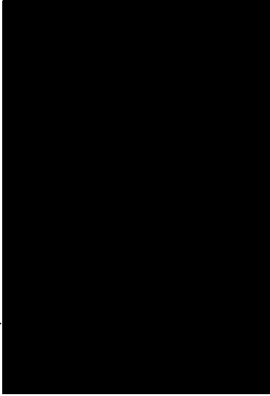



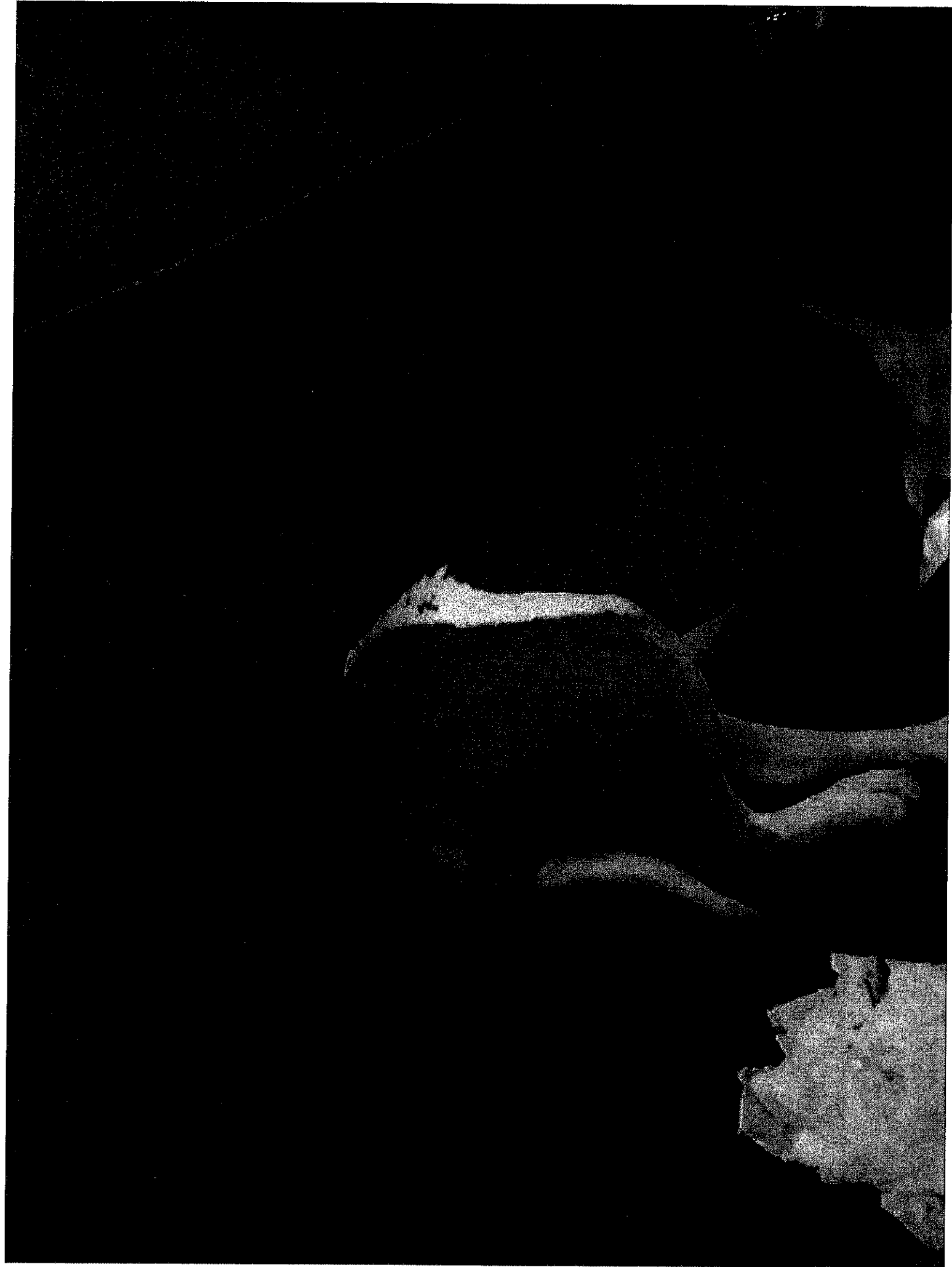

### **6.05.010: POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOG DEFINED:**

"Potentially dangerous dog" means any of the following:

A. Any dog which, when unprovoked, on two (2) separate occasions within the prior thirty six (36) month period, engaged in any behavior that required a defensive action by any person to prevent bodily injury when the person and the dog were off the property of the owner or keeper of the dog.

B. Any dog which, when unprovoked, bites a person causing a less severe injury than as defined in section 6.05.030 of this chapter.

C. Any dog which, when unprovoked, on two (2) separate occasions within the prior thirty six (36) month period, has seriously bitten, inflicted injury, or otherwise caused injury attacking a domestic animal off the property of the owner or keeper of the dog.

D. Any dog off the property of the owner or keeper of the dog, when unprovoked, has killed a domestic animal. (Ord. 2695 § 1, 2008: Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

### **6.05.020: VICIOUS DOG DEFINED:**

"Vicious dog" means any of the following:

A. Any dog seized under section 599aa of the California Penal Code and upon the sustaining of a conviction of the owner or keeper under subdivision (a), section 597.5 of the Penal Code;

B. Any dog which, when unprovoked, in an aggressive manner, inflicts severe injury on or kills a human being;

C. Any dog previously determined to be and currently listed as a potentially dangerous dog which, after its owner or keeper has been notified of this determination, continues the behavior described in section 6.05.010 of this chapter or is maintained in violation of section 6.05.110, 6.05.120 or 6.05.130 of this chapter. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.030: SEVERE INJURY DEFINED:**

"Severe injury" means any physical injury to a human being that results in muscle tears or disfiguring lacerations or requires multiple sutures, or corrective or cosmetic surgery. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.040: IMPOUNDED DEFINED:**

"Impounded" means taken into the custody of the public pound or animal control department or provider of animal control services to the city. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.050: ANIMAL CONTROL BOARD:**

There is created an animal control board to administer the provisions of this chapter. The board shall be made up of three (3) members, and include three (3) city administrative managers designated by the city manager. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.060: HEARING ON DECLARATION OF DOG AS POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS:**

A. If an animal control officer or a law enforcement officer determines that probable cause exists to believe a dog is potentially dangerous or vicious, the chief officer of the public pound or animal control department or his or her immediate supervisor, or the chief of police, or his or her designee, shall either: 1) on a form prescribed by the city, obtain the written acknowledgment of the owner of the dog that such dog is potentially dangerous or vicious as defined by this chapter, and the owner's written consent to comply with the requirements of sections 6.05.110 to 6.05.160 of this chapter, and any conditions imposed by the city pursuant to such sections, within ten (10) days of the date of the determination; or 2) file a petition with the animal control board for a hearing to determine whether or not the dog in question should be declared potentially dangerous or vicious. Whenever possible, any complaint received from a member of the public that a dog might be potentially dangerous or vicious shall be sworn to and verified by the complainant and attached to the petition.

B. The animal control board shall notify the owner or keeper of the dog that it will hold a hearing and that the owner or keeper may present evidence at the hearing. The animal control board shall serve upon the owner or keeper of the dog the notice of the hearing and a copy of the petition either personally or by first class mail with return receipt requested.

The hearing shall be open to the public and held not less than five (5) working days nor more than ten (10) working days after service of the notice upon the owner or keeper of the dog. The animal control board may admit all relevant evidence, including incident reports and affidavits of witnesses, limit the scope of discovery, and may shorten the time to produce records or witnesses. The animal control board may decide all issues even if the owner or keeper fails to appear at the hearing. The animal control board may find, upon a preponderance of the evidence, that the dog is potentially dangerous or vicious and make other orders authorized by this chapter. (Ord. 2796, 2013)

**6.05.070: DETERMINATION AND ORDERS; NOTICE; COMPLIANCE:**

After the hearing conducted pursuant to section 6.05.060 of this chapter, the animal control board shall, either personally or by first class mail, postage prepaid, notify the owner or keeper of the dog in writing of the determination and orders issued. If the board determines that the dog is potentially dangerous or vicious, the owner or keeper shall comply with sections 6.05.110 to 6.05.160 of this chapter within ten (10) days after the date of the determination. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.080: APPEAL:**

If any party contests the determination, that party may, within five (5) days of the receipt of the notice of determination, appeal the animal control board's decision to the superior court of the county of San Bernardino. The person appealing the decision shall serve personally or by first class mail, postage prepaid, notice of the appeal upon the other party. The appeal shall be conducted pursuant to California Food And Agricultural Code sections 31622, 31623, and 31624. (Ord. 2596 § 1, 2005: Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.090: SEIZURE AND IMPOUNDMENT PENDING HEARING:**

If the animal control officer or law enforcement officer determines that probable cause exists to believe the dog in question poses an immediate threat to public safety, he or she may seize and impound the dog pending the hearings held pursuant to this chapter. If the dog is later adjudicated potentially dangerous or vicious, the owner or keeper of the dog will be liable for costs and expenses of impounding the dog. If the chief animal control officer determines that the impoundment is not contrary to public safety, he or she shall permit the animal to be confined in a city approved kennel or veterinary facility, at the owner's expense. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.100: CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH DOGS MAY NOT BE DECLARED POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS:**

A. The animal control board may not declare the dog potentially dangerous or vicious if the dog inflicted injury or damage to a person committing a wilful trespass or other tort upon the premises occupied by the owner or keeper of the dog, or was teasing, tormenting, abusing or assaulting the dog, or was committing or attempting to commit a crime. The dog may not be declared potentially dangerous or vicious if it was protecting or defending a person within the dog's immediate vicinity from an unjustified attack or assault. A dog may not be declared potentially dangerous or vicious if the injury or damage was sustained by a domestic animal which was teasing, tormenting, abusing or assaulting the dog.

B. A dog may not be declared potentially dangerous or vicious if the injury or damage to a domestic animal was sustained while the dog was working as a hunting dog, herding dog, or predator control dog on the property of or under the control of its owner or keeper, and the damage or injury was to a type of domestic animal appropriate to the dog's work. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.110: POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DESIGNATION MAINTAINED IN REGISTRATION RECORDS:**

Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 6.04 of this title regarding licensing and vaccination, all potentially dangerous dogs shall be properly licensed and vaccinated. A dog determined to be potentially dangerous must have that designation in its registration records. The city may charge a potentially dangerous dog fee in addition to the regular licensing fee to provide for the increased costs of maintaining the records of the dog. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.120: KEEPING AND CONTROLLING POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS:**

The owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog must keep the dog indoors or in a securely fenced yard from which the dog cannot escape and into which children cannot trespass. A potentially dangerous dog may be off the owner's or keeper's premises only if it is restrained by a substantial leash of appropriate length and if it is under a responsible adult's control. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.130: DEATH, SALE, TRANSFER OR PERMANENT REMOVAL; NOTICE:**

The owner or keeper of a potentially dangerous dog shall notify the animal control bureau, in writing within three (3) days of any change, if the potentially dangerous dog dies, is sold, transferred, or permanently removed from the city. (Ord. 2392 § 11, 1998: Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.140: REMOVAL FROM LIST OF POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS DOGS:**

The animal control board shall remove a dog from the list of potentially dangerous dogs if no additional instances of behavior described in section 6.05.010 of this chapter occur within a thirty six (36) month period from the date of designation as a potentially dangerous dog. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.150: DESTRUCTION; NONDESTRUCTION; CONDITIONS; ENCLOSURES:**

A vicious dog may be destroyed if the animal control board determines that the release of the dog would create a significant threat to the public health, safety and welfare. If the board determines that the vicious dog should not be destroyed, it must impose conditions upon the dog's owner or keeper that will protect the public health, safety and welfare. If one of the conditions is to require that the vicious dog be confined in an enclosure, the enclosure must be designed in order to prevent the animal from escaping and include a fence or structure suitable to prevent young children from entering. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.160: PROHIBITION OF OWNING, POSSESSING, CONTROLLING OR HAVING CUSTODY:**

The city of Redlands may prohibit the owner of a vicious dog from owning, possessing, controlling or having custody of any dog for a period of up to three (3) years when the animal control board finds, after proceedings conducted under sections 6.05.060 to 6.05.100 of this chapter that such ownership or possession would create a significant threat to the public health, safety and welfare. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.170: FINES AND LIMITS:**

Any violation of this chapter involving a potentially dangerous dog shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00). Any violation of this chapter involving a vicious dog shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)

**6.05.180: FORMS:**

All forms prepared by the judicial counsel pursuant to California Food And Agricultural Code section 31682 shall be used to give effect to this chapter. (Ord. 2135 § 2, 1990)
