### A Message from the Chief

It is my pleasure to present to you the 2022 Annual Report of the Redlands Police Department (RPD). This report highlights some of the exceptional work of our department members and reflects on our commitment to enhancing public safety through trust, innovation, community partnerships, and excellence in service. The year 2022 brought a continued focus on the delivery of public safety services to the community we serve, and we thank you for entrusting us with your safety and well-being as we continue to strive for excellence in all facets of policing.

As recommended by the leadership of the nation's law enforcement community and approved by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program has transitioned from the Summary Reporting System (SRS) to the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). This change was implemented to improve the overall quality of crime data collected by law enforcement and more accurately reflect current crime and related activities. Unlike the aggregate crime data reported through the traditional SRS, NIBRS goes much deeper due to its ability to provide circumstances and context for crimes like location, time of day, and whether the incident was cleared. When used to its full potential, NIBRS identifies, with precision, when and where crime takes place, what form it takes, and the characteristics of its victims and perpetrators. This information allows law enforcement to better understand crime and define the resources we need to fight crime, as well as use those resources in the most efficient and effective manner.

As a result of the transition to NIBRS, some of RPD's crime data will look significantly different for 2022 compared to past years. The discrepancies will be explained in greater detail within this report. I am proud of the work captured in this report, and I hope that you find it informative. As Chief of Police, it is my personal and professional honor to serve the community with the staff of the Redlands Police Department, and we thank you for your ongoing support into 2023. This report can be used as a foundation to continuously improve policing strategies and community relationships.

RPD Dashboard statistics will not match prior years' Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Report (UCR), as the data in the UCR is reflective of reported crimes that occurred exclusively in the City of Redlands and is not inclusive of the crimes that occurred in the Donut Hole.









#### Did You Know? 98% of Homicides Solved!

Since 1996, RPD has cleared 98% of the murders reported in the City of Redlands, for a clearance rate nearly twice as high as the national average.



## **Innovation in Investigations**

The Redlands Police Department (RPD) has been able to solve numerous crimes by leveraging resources through innovative force multipliers. Aerial drones are cost effective, efficient force multipliers that provide improved situational awareness and enhanced operational response by RPD. Drones are utilized for crime scene analysis and traffic scene reconstruction, as well as searching for suspects and missing persons. In 2022, drones were deployed by FAA-certified and licensed RPD operators on approximately 20 occasions.

Another significant investigative tool that enables RPD to perform efficiently is the community-based camera system, consisting of approximately 80 fixed and/or panning cameras and 63 automated license plate reader (ALPR) cameras (24 of which are funded through community donations) that are strategically placed throughout the city. The cameras routinely provide leads in both violent and property crime cases, with leads developed in over 140 cases in the last three years. RPD has been able to utilize these investigative leads towards the identification of various suspects, vehicles, and persons of interest involved in active criminal investigations.

With the increase of public and private sector video technology, RPD has seen an increase of reports submitted that include video footage capturing criminal activity. Many videos have captured quality images that can be utilized to identify the suspect. RPD continues to utilize GPS technology and will deploy this technology to address crime trends that are occurring in the City of Redlands.


#### **Traffic Unit**

The Traffic Unit provides traffic enforcement, related investigations, and special traffic services within the City. The unit also enforces parking standards and provides traffic control for special events within the City.

The Traffic Unit also administers the Office of Traffic Safety grant that is used to conduct DUI checkpoints; DUI saturation patrols; speeding, red light, and stop sign enforcement; and pedestrian/bicycle enforcement. In addition, the grant funds community educational programs and collaborative DUI and traffic enforcement with other agencies. In 2022, the grant amount awarded was \$130,000.


In 2022, a total of 1,191 parking citations were issued within the City.


